WCHD/CDC Updated COVID Guidelines Lake Tahoe School – January 2022

On January 7, 2022, the Nevada Department of Health and Human Services released a revision to Directive 048 Full Guidance based on quarantine and isolation guidance affecting school settings released by the CDC on January 4, 2022.

The following updated information applies to all faculty, staff, and K-12 students at Lake Tahoe School beginning Thursday, January 13, 2022.

Isolation relates to behavior after a confirmed infection. Isolation for 5 days followed by wearing a well-fitting mask will minimize the risk of spreading the virus to others.

Quarantine refers to the time following exposure to the virus or close contact with someone known to have COVID-19.

Isolation of Students and Staff Testing Positive for COVID-19:

- Any individual who tests positive for COVID, regardless of symptoms or vaccination status, must isolate for a minimum of 5 days.
- If after 5 days the individual is symptom free or symptoms are resolving (minimum 24 hours with no fever and without use of fever reducing medications and other symptoms are improving), *they may return to school on the 6th day.*
- Following return to school, strict adherence to face mask requirements must be followed.

Quarantine of Close Contacts:

- Close Contacts that are unvaccinated or under vaccinated (one vaccination or both vaccinations not yet in full effect), as defined by the CDC must quarantine for 5 days.
- If after 5 days the individual is symptom free (minimum 24 hours with no fever and without use of fever reducing medications), and tests negative with at least an antigen rapid test, *they may return to school on the 6th day.*
- Following return to school, strict adherence to face mask requirements must be followed.
- Close Contacts that are fully vaccinated as defined by the CDC or who have had confirmed COVID-19 within the last 90 days, and who are symptom free, do not have to quarantine.
- If symptoms develop, individual should follow isolation instructions.
- Lake Tahoe School requires that all close contacts and exposures be tested on or after 5 days of last exposure and shared with the school. PCR tests are preferred, though antigen tests are acceptable as well.
